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Haunted House season is here!

It is one of my favorite times of the year! It is very important that each chapter planning to run a haunted house takes a few steps to ensure they are covered under our MIJC insurance policy.

The good news is that in general your chapter's haunted house will be covered under your chapter insurance through the MIJCs. There needs to be two things done for this to happen (1) your chapter must currently be purchasing their insurance through the MIJCs and (2) you need to complete and return the "Haunted House Insurance" survey to me prior to your haunted house (see page 11). The insurance agency will review your survey and has the right to ask your chapter to add on an insurance rider (which will be a cost to your chapter.) This will only happen if your house is deemed to be more liable than our insurance would normally cover.

If you have not done so already this year and are planning to run a haunted house, please complete the survey right away and get it back to me. It will take about a week for the underwriter to determine if your haunted house needs to purchase additional insurance coverage. Your haunted house will not be covered until this survey is signed off on by our insurance agency!

I have also included in this Hotline a generic waiver for volunteers (see page 12). We encourage all chapters to require a volunteer waiver in order to work their respective haunted houses.

Additionally, **JCI Presenter** is part 1 of a 2 part training program formally known as PRIME (for us more veteran members). Changing PRIME to a 2 part program (JCI Presenter and JCI Trainer) allows members to attend each part on a more convenient schedule and with less cost. 😊

The Syllabus for **JCI Presenter** is as follows:

- **Module 1: OPENING**  
Participants are welcomed to the course and will speak for the first time during this session to introduce themselves.
- **Module 2: PRESENTATION TYPES**  
This module will cover the most common types of presentations and the characteristics of each one.
- **Module 3: AUDIENCE ANALYSIS**  
This module covers the importance of understanding the audience, what they know, what they should be told and what pre conceptions or prejudices they may hold.
- **Module 4: PRESENTATION CONTENT**  
This module will cover the preparation of the presentation content in an orderly format that will keep the audience's attention to the message.
- **Module 5: EFFECTIVE DELIVERY**  
This module will explain the different techniques for effective presentation delivery.
- **Module 6: PRESENTATIONS**  
All participants will individually deliver their prepared presentation to the audience. The trainers' team will comment on possible improvements and how the participants applied the course content to their presentations.
- **Module 7: CLOSING**  
Review of course and presentation of certificates. Course and Trainers evaluation will be done here. Closing will explain the next steps in JCI Training.
